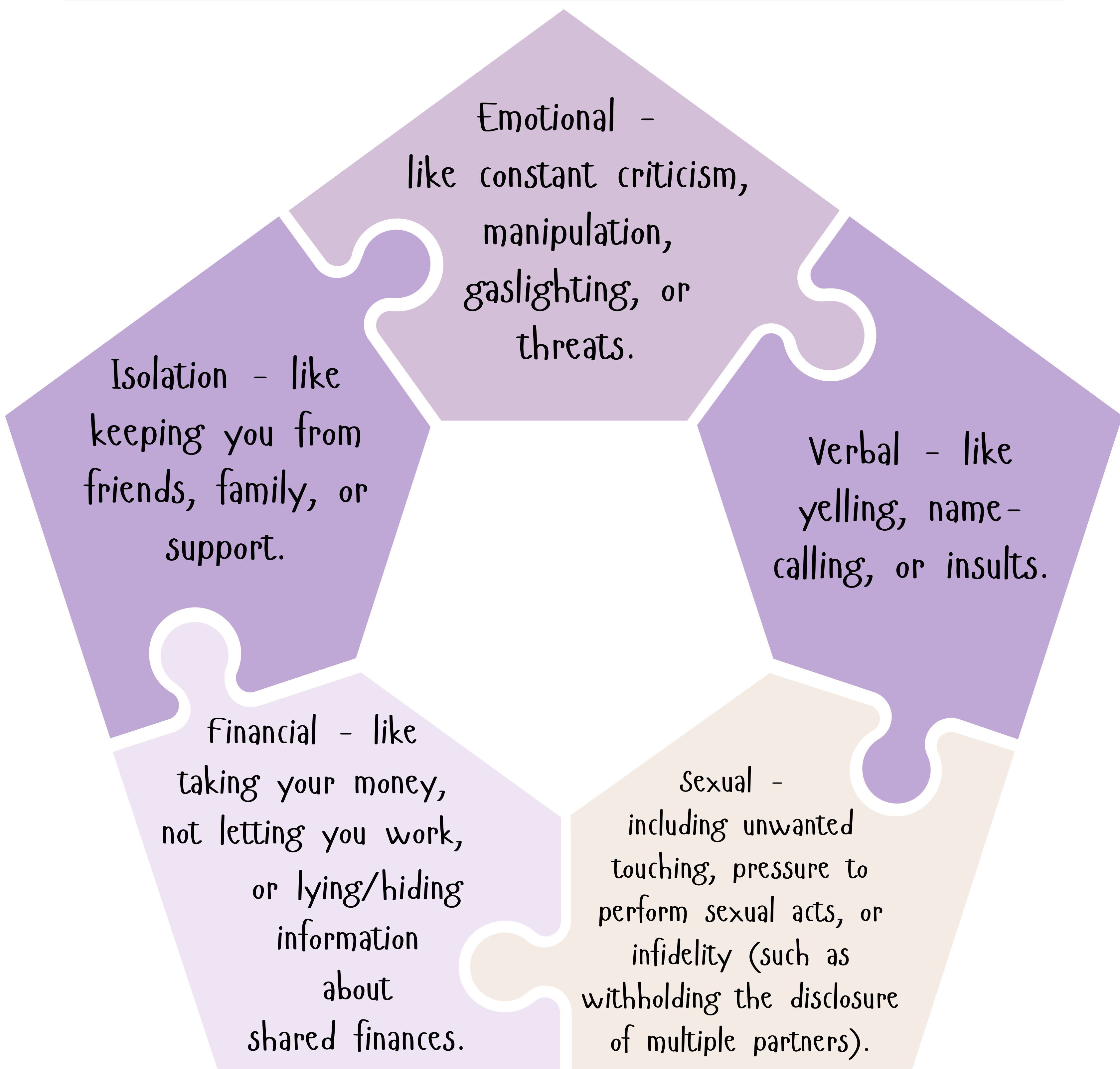

What is Domestic Violence?

Domestic violence is a pattern of behaviours used by one person to gain power and control over another. It can happen to anyone, and it doesn't always look the way people expect.

Domestic violence isn't just physical. It can also be:

Emergency Income Supports

GOVERNMENT OF ALBERTA EMERGENCY FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

- Can cover costs such as food, clothing, childcare, transportation, temporary shelter, and eviction payments. Call 1 (877)644-9992

EMERGENCY HOTEL STAY

- Alberta Works can provide temporary funding for you and your children to stay in a hotel if shelters are full. The length of the stay depends on your situation and can be extended day-to-day.
- Call the number above Monday-Friday from 7:30am – 8:00pm or the after-hours number: 1 (866) 644-5135

ESCAPING ABUSE BENEFIT

- Can cover costs such as emergency transportation, basic needs, prescription drugs, childcare, dental and eye care services, one-time costs to move within Alberta or Canada if you must leave your community, a one-time allowance to help set up a new home, the damage deposit for a new home, and extended health coverage for adults and children from families with limited incomes

VICTIMS OF CRIME FINANCIAL BENEFITS PROGRAM

- If you were a victim of a crime in Alberta that you reported to police, you can apply for an injury, witness or death benefit

RESTITUTION AND RECOVERY FOR VICTIMS OF CRIME

- Ask the judge to have an offender pay you back for expenses caused by the crime they committed against you

Legal Support

CPS can investigate and help you to get a peace bond (an order under the Criminal Code that sets conditions on the person who behaved violently). They can refer you to victim services or a lawyer, who can help you get a non-criminal protection order - also known as "no-contact orders" or "restraining orders" - to keep the person who harmed you away from you.

When you ask officials like the police, a social worker or a lawyer for information, you can ask them to keep your concerns confidential.

VICTIM SERVICES

Victim services organizations work with the police to help victims of crime. They can help you develop a plan and find ways to protect yourself, and connect you with services for food, clothing and shelter.

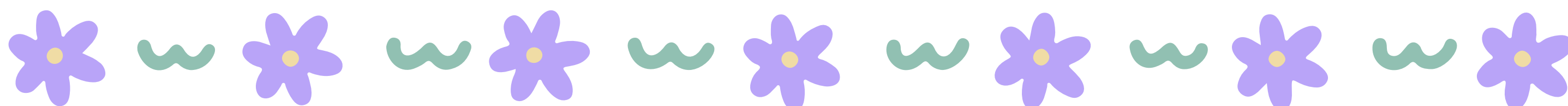

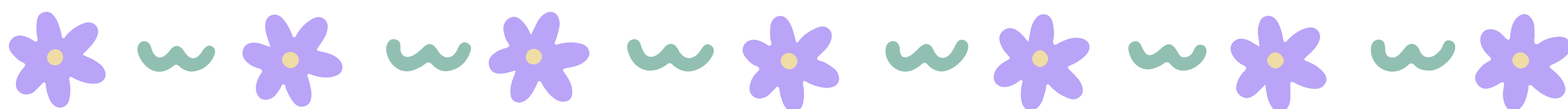

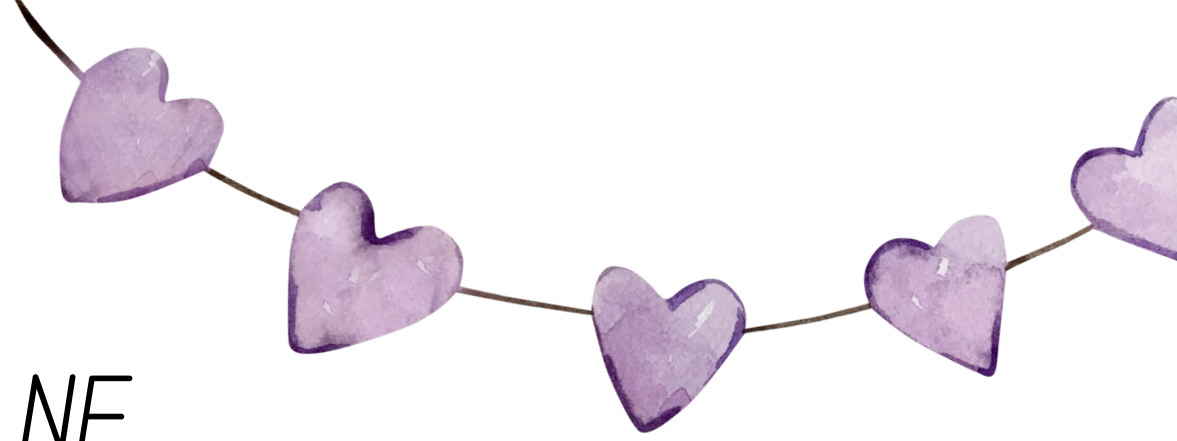

If you have serious injuries, you should go to a hospital. CSART provides confidential medical care, emotional support, reporting options, forensic examination and evidence collection for people who have been sexually assaulted in the last 4-7 days.

Go to Sheldon M. Chumir Health Care urgent care, or any emergency department, and tell the triage nurse when you check-in that you've been sexually assaulted.
